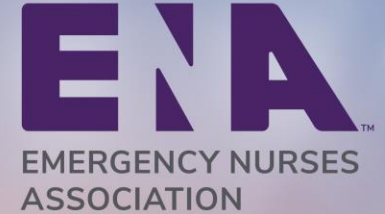

- Taught TNCC courses in Armenia, Italy, Poland, Germany and Spain. and taught TNCC and ENPC for the Army.



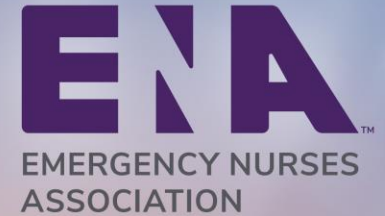

- Otero County SANE Liaison



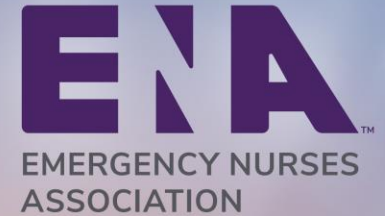

- Served as Pediatric Chair for the Arkansas State ENA



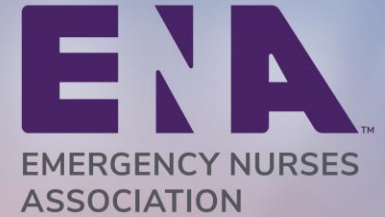

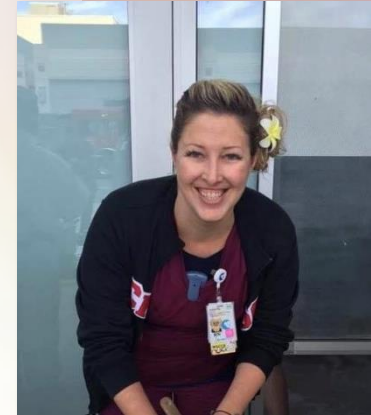
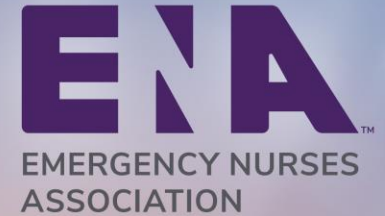


# Amanda Webb
